

TOYOHARI - EAST ASIAN NEEDLE THERAPY



Toyohari is a form of Keiraku Chiryo - Meridian Therapy. It is a theoretically simple but technically sophisticated complete system of acupuncture. It is different from most other forms of acupuncture in that it uses a more delicate treatment method, placing great emphasis on the use of pulse diagnosis and palpation skills. The Toyohari Association has developed quite unique training and teaching methods that can accelerate the learning of skills that usually take many years of practice to develop. Evolving out of earlier developments in Meridian Therapy in the 1930's and 1940's, the Toyohari Association was

founded by Kodo Fukushima in 1959. He and his colleagues decided that they needed to establish a separate Keiraku Chiryo organization to focus on helping other blind practitioners to study and practice. Since that time, the Toyohari Association has developed along their own path, innovating some quite new treatment methods, refinements in diagnostic and treatment techniques, a highly structured educational process, and training sighted students.

The Australasian Branch has developed a training program that follows the Tokyo and European based program. Graduation from the 120-hour (20 day) program entitles the graduate to join the Toyohari Association through one of its Australian or New Zealand branches and become a Registered Toyohari Practitioner (*Japan*). The principle purpose of the branches are to foster and improve clinical skills by providing ongoing study opportunities both in Branch study groups and study sessions with senior instructors in Japan, Europe and the USA. The Australasian Branch of the Toyohari Association has been established to provide the structure for these educational opportunities. Graduates will receive a certificate signed by the Australasian Branch and the Tokyo headquarters of the Association. Upon joining one of the branches, a certificate of registration will also be issued, which is renewed annually through the Australasian Branch.

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Diagnosis

The Four Sho Pattern Confirmation. This is based on five phase acupuncture theory and looking, touching, listening/smelling, and questioning diagnosis to determine the most vacuous root energetic pattern in the Qi balance system. Focusing especially on six position pulse and middle pulse diagnosis using the Generative and Controlling cycles, as well as touch diagnosis for the meridians and hara

Kozato Method

This is a group study method used to improve ones needling techniques, point location and pulse evaluations. Within this section we also learn: Shisei - proper posture for optimal needling; Oshide and Sashide - training point location hand and needling hand; Live point location - this differs from the anatomical locations.

Needle Techniques and Root Treatment

Many techniques are either non-inserted or very shallow in accordance with the practitioner feeling the arrival of Qi. These will include - Ho (*supplementation*) technique; Basic Sha and 5 Sha (*dispersion*) techniques with three types (*ko, ken, jin*) for excess conditions arising from deficient Qi using dispersion within tonification to separate pathogenic Qi from healthy Qi and two types (*fu and gen*) for true excess arising from pathogenic Qi; Waho (*harmonizing*) technique used for stagnation of Qi; Sanshin (*contact needling*) techniques for whole body areas or meridians, as well as various other techniques.

Supportive and Branch Treatments

Kikei (*Extraordinary Vessels*) techniques using zinc and copper pellets; Shigo technique using a thirty gauge gold needle with the Chinese Clock theory; Naso and Muno techniques utilizing the neck, shoulder, inguinal and sacro areas for symptomatic relief; Okyu (*direct moxa*) and Chinetsukyu (*warming cone moxa*); Shiraku (*specialized microbleeding techniques*); Kyukaku (*specialized cupping techniques*); Enpishin (*press tack needle*); Hinaishin (*intradermal needle therapy*); and Ryu (*press spheres*).

Graduates will considerably improve their pulse and tactile diagnostic and assessment skills. ... Graduates will also develop a greater sense of qi sensitivity through applying the needling techniques of the Association. ... Graduates will learn a range of methods specifically aimed at relieving symptoms.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Specialised tools needed will include silver needles and press spheres of silver, gold, zinc and copper.

Other needles will be the teishin, zanshin, enshin, intradermals, press tack, and microbleeding needle. Lastly, we will also work with the Japanese cups.

A kit made up of the basic tools needed to participate in the course and the required text "Meridian Therapy" will be included in the course fee and distributed at the course. This equipment will be supplied by Helio Supply. Code details for additional equipment is listed below.
